Mohammad Khalid Khursheed Khan took oath as the Chief Minister of Gilgit Baltistan. People continue to feel uncertain of their political future. They point to various promises made by political parties over the years which are yet to be fulfilled. A major grievance of the people is that the region is yet to be recognized as a province and they should enjoy all the rights like other provinces of the country. The economy of the region is stagnating and many of the approved projects remain incomplete due to lack of funds. The Government is trying to provide better health facilities in the region by improving the conditions in the Divisional Headquarter Hospital in Chilas. Baba Jan and the other activists who were languishing in jail for ten long years were released. Political leaders from Pakistan People's Party and the Awami Workers' Party have condemned the detention of two students of the Karakoram International University (KIU), Gilgit who were protesting against the sexual misconduct of a University official.

After nearly 10 years of incarceration and an incredible struggle for justice, political activist Baba Jan, along with other activists, has been released from the jail in Gilgit. His party, the Awami Workers Party, said, Baba Jan and the other activists were "punished for speaking up for the affectees of the Attabad Lake disaster and for the rights of the working people of GB over their own resources". In any civilised society, his fight for a justified cause would have been welcomed. Instead, he was labelled as a terrorist and left to languish in a jail. Although he is a free man today, his time in prison has come at a huge cost to him and his family, and indeed to the wider community. Activists like him provide an essential service to communities during crises. They also give people hope when the authorities have forsaken them. To reward his struggle with a prison sentence was sheer cruelty.

Retired Col Obaid Ullah Beg Senior is expected to be sworn in as minister for industries, labour and commerce, Raja Zakaria as minister for forests, wildlife and environment, Fateh Ullah Khan as minister for planning and development and information, Shams Lone as minister for food, Haji Hameed as minister for local government and rural development, Mushtaq Hussain as minister for water and power, Raja Nasir as minister of tourism, culture, youth affairs and sports, Raja Azam as minister for education, Jawed Manwa as minister for finance, Haji Gulbar as minister for health, Wazir Saleem as minister of works, Mesam Kazim as minister of agriculture and Shah Baig as minister for excise, zakat and ushr.

PM orders swift work on GB's provisional provincial status

Prime Minister Imran Khan has pledged that the federal government will work on fast track basis to grant the provincial status to Gilgit-Baltistan in order to address the sense of deprivation of the people of the region. Addressing the oath-taking ceremony of the new cabinet member of Gilgit-Baltistan, the Prime Minister said that a committee to this effect will be constituted and it will work under a time frame. Unveiling his plan for development and welfare of the people of GB, Imran Khan said the present government's Ehsaas Programme, which is the largest poverty alleviation programme in Pakistan's history, will be introduced in GB as well. He said that 300MW hydro electricity will be generated, which will be more than sufficient for the region. He said that two hydroelectricity power stations are being constructed; two others are in the pipeline while two more have been approved. Besides, he said, micro hydro power stations will also be set up. The Prime Minister said that a special economic zone (SEZ) will also be constructed in GB where industries will be relocated.

AJK President slams establishing Indian Army settlement in Badgam

The Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) President Sardar Masood Khan has expressed serious concern over Indian government's move to build the first military settlement in Budgam district of the occupied Kashmir where ex-servicemen who massacred Kashmiris would be settled. In a statement issued on Saturday, he said that India had already constructed two military settlements in Jammu region, but it had so far failed to build such settlements in Kashmir valley because of opposition by the political parties and the freedom groups. However, he maintained that now the revenue department of occupied Kashmir had expedited the process to transfer 200 kanals (25 acres) agricultural land to the military officials for purpose.

Detention of two KIU students condemned

Political leaders from Pakistan Peoples Party and the Awami Workers' Party have condemned the detention of two students of the Karakoram International University(KIU), Gilgit. The two students, identified as Tauqueer and Faisal, were detained for a couple of days. They were reportedly involved in organizing protest demonstrations after students of KIU accused an official of sexual misconduct and harassment. Hundreds of students had protested at the KIU Gilgit campus, and also in Skardu and Hunza, demanding action against the accused official.

GB Assembly's member Said Danish, spokesperson of the PPP, has described the detention of the students a 'shameless' act, accusing the university of trying to protect officials involved in sexual harassment of students. She has also demanded installation of the cameras in all offices and classes rooms of KIU to ensure safety of the students. She has also expressed concerns over the 'constant reports' of sexual harassment emerging from KIU, the only center of higher learning in the Giglit Division of GB.

Committee set up on provincial status for GB

Prime Minister Imran Khan has constituted a 12-member committee to make recommendations for granting Gilgit-Baltistan the status of a provisional province of Pakistan. Federal minister for Kashmir Affairs and Gilgit- Baltistan, Ali Amin Gandapur heads the committee, which also comprises of GB Chief Minister Mohammad Khalid Khurshid, the attorney general of Pakistan, federal secretaries for finance, defence, foreign affairs, parliamentary affairs, GB chief secretary, joint secretary of the GB Council and representatives of security agencies as members.

The committee is tasked with making the recommendations keeping in view the United Nations resolutions on the disputed region of Kashmir and a judgment of the Supreme Court of Pakistan on determining the GB status. The committee will complete the task within two months. According to official sources, the Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf government will table a bill in the National Assembly to amend the constitution to declare GB as constitutional part of Pakistan.

Previous governments responsible for power crisis in GB: Power Minister

that the progress on PSDP approved projects in Gilgit-Baltistan which includes Henzel 20 MW, Shagar Thing 26 MW, Thak Chilas 4 MW, Harpo 34 MW and Naltar Phase-III 16 MW PSDP was not satisfactory. He said that after completing the survey of 32 MW project in Ghawari and 32 MW project in Hunza, PC-1 was ready and work would start soon by including it in PSDP.
