Changing GB's status

The proposed legislation which proposes to accord a provisional provincial status to Gilgit-Baltistan has already been submitted to Prime Minister Imran Khan. It will not affect Pakistan's position on the issue of Jammu & Kashmir as per the UN resolutions. The provisional status is meant to signify that the final status of GB will be determined according to the requirements of the UN resolutions.

The bill proposes the establishment of a provincial assembly in Gilgit-Baltistan and representation to GB in the Parliament in Islamabad. It also proposes replacement of the Chief GB court as a high court and the reestablishment of the Appellate Court along the same lines as in AJK. It will also bring GB within the jurisdiction of the Pakistan Supreme Court and merging of GB Election Commission into ECP.

The move is a step in the right direction as it respects the aspirations of the people of GB who expressed this demand though a unanimous resolution passed in the GB Assembly in March this year. The strategic area has also gained more importance with the establishing of CPEC and there is a greater need than ever to integrate it further into the mainstream.

PTI's Abdul Qayyum Niazi elected new prime minister of AJK

PTI candidate Sardar Abdul Qayyum Niazi on Wednesday got elected as the new Prime Minister of Azad Jammu Kashmir on Wednesday by a comfortable margin. President Azad Jammu and Kashmir Sardar Masood Khan administered the oath to him, after which he became the 13th prime minister of the region, taking over the reins from former premier Raja Farooq Haider.

Niazi secured the premiership by a comfortable margin, bagging 33 votes, PML-N's and candidate, Chaudhry Lateef Akbar, managed to win only 15 votes. Earlier today, Prime Minister Imran Khan had nominated Niazi as the PTI's candidate for the post. Federal Minister for Information and Broadcasting Fawad Chaudhry announced that Prime Minister Imran Khan had nominated Niazi as the ruling party's candidate for the position. In a tweet, the minister said that PM Imran had made the decision after extensive consultations and reviewing all the proposals. "He is a dynamic and genuine political activist and his heart beats for the people," he said.

Niazi won the AJK polls from the LA-18 constituency. He was not among the leading candidates for the prized post. Initially, Barristers Sultan Mahmood and Sardar Tanveer Ilyas Khan were being considered as the AJK PM.

Profile: Abdul Qayyum Niazi

Prime Minister Imran Khan has pulled a surprise in AJK by appointing Sardar Abdul Qayyum Niazi as the Prime Minister. Needless to say that this move has left pundits, observers and even PTI insiders, who were expecting either Barrister Sultan Mahmood or Sardar Tanveer Ilyas to get the nod, scratching their heads.

Niazi, who joined PTI two years ago after parting ways with the All Jammu and Kashmir Muslim Conference (AJKMC), contested and won from the LA-18 Poonch-1 constituency. After Imran Khan's decision, Qayyum Niazi took oath as the 13th PM of Azad Jammu and Kashmir.

Niazi was born in a Darra Sher Khan town located on the Line of Control in tehsil Abbaspur of district Poonch. He got his graduation degree from the Azad Kashmir University. He became the district councilor of Poonch in 1982 when he stepped into politics. His family had a long-standing association with AJKMC party. He was first elected to the AJK assembly in 2006 on the ticket of AJKMC. He served as minister for finance, prisons, and some other portfolios during 2006 to 2011.

Niazi's elder brother, Sardar Ghulam Mustafa, was also elected to the legislative assembly twice and served as a minister both times. A younger brother, Sardar Habib Zia, is a senior lawyer of the Supreme Court of AJK. Niazi also has a third brother settled in

the US, and a son, who is a Labour Party's councilor for London in the UK.

How diverse is the new assembly of Azad Kashmir?

Looking at the age, gender, profession and educational qualifications of the newly elected members of the AJK assembly brings out some interesting facts.

There are no young politicians in the 25-30 years age group. In the last general election, 5% of the elected assembly members were from this age group. An overwhelming majority of more than 60 percent of the elected members are over 50.

82 percent of the new lawmakers are college graduates. This category has shown a huge improvement from 58% graduate lawmakers who had entered the assembly in the last election. There are zero PhD or MPhil holders.

A majority of new lawmakers are business owners (58%) with a significant minority of lawyers (18%) followed by landlords or agriculturists. Six women have made it to the 53-member assembly, of which one was elected on a general seat. The other five have been nominated on reserved seats.

Tehreek-e-Islaami 'wins' GB by-polls

After a close contest, Tehreek-e-Islaami Pakistan (TIP) won the Gilgit-Baltistan by-election in the Nagar valley with a narrow margin of 278 votes from its nearest rival, the ruling Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf (PTI).

As per news reports, the by-polls in constituency GB-4 Nagar-I were held peacefully and a large number of male and female voters cast their votes. As per official results, TIP candidate Ayyub Waziri received 5341 votes and won the seat against the PTI candidate Agha Beheshti, who managed only 5063 votes. Pakistan People's Party (PPP) candidate Javed Hussain obtained 4194 votes for the third position.

On the day of counting, the Tehreek supporters said that the returning officer was delaying the announcement of results purposefully and accused him of having corrupt intentions. These supporters then besieged his office forcing the returning officer to call in the police. The Police then sprang into action and dispersed the protestors.

The Case for Realignment of KKH at Taata Pani

One of the most vulnerable spots of Karakoram Highway in the GilgitBaltistan region, without a doubt, is the "Taata Pani" area, named so due to the presence of hot springs in the area. This area can arguably be called as one of the bottlenecks of the Karakoram Highway because it is highly prone to natural hazards. Even during a light shower, landslides, mudslides and floods are common in this area hindering traffic every now and then. In the past, during major landslides or floods, the area has remained blocked for days disconnecting GB from the rest of Pakistan. During prolonged blockades, edibles and petroleum products almost always become short in supplies in the region's markets, as was the case recently.

To find a lasting solution to this problem, it is suggested that the KKH may be realigned at least 5 kilometers downstream and shifted to the right bank of the river Indus so as to bypass the blockage prone left bank. The terrain on the right bank is stable and the mountains are rocky. This will not only reduce the financial burden on the government but will also instrumental in ensuring the flow of tourists and goods along the CPEC route.

Addressing a function in honor of the families of martyrs' on the occasion of Police Martyrs' Day at PTC, Inspector General of Police Gilgit-Baltistan, Muhammad Saeed Wazir called Gilgit-Baltistan as the land of martyrs and conquerors.

He also thanked the provincial government, especially Chief Minister Khalid Khurshid, for making the martyrs' package equal to other provinces. Earlier, families of martyred

soldiers used to get 3 million rupees but now they will get 10 million.

He also announced that the son or daughter of a martyr will be recruited in the ASI rank. The department will also pay for their children's education. Commenting on the possibility of a Shia-Sunni flare up during Moharram, the IGP said that Muharram is about to start and anti-national elements and enemies of the region will try to sabotage the atmosphere of peace and brotherhood. He praised the people of GB for not giving in to the divisive forces and maintaining an atmosphere of peace.

Federal Law Minister Farogh Naseem has said that steps that are being taken to make Gilgit-Baltistan a province will soon yield tangible results. Gilgit-Baltistan will be represented in the Senate in the National Assembly. The law Minister said that the Kashmir cause needs to be seriously considered while formulating the legislation that makes GB a provisional province. However, the opposition must refrain from playing politics over such a delicate issue. provisional The provincial status will provide GB with representation **National** in the assembly and the Senate.

Talking about the 18th amendment, he said that the 18th amendment was

passed jointly by PML-N and PPP and further improvement was needed in the 18th amendment. He also targeted the PPP government in Sindh and blamed its corrupt practices for causing a lot of damage and bringing disrepute to the province. Farogh Naseem also made the demand of bringing local governments in the whole of Sindh. He, however denied any discussion on creation of new provinces and said that MQM and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf are performing very well in Sindh and will change the balance of power in the future.
