In this Edition

Of late, Pakistan has been contemplating on converting Gilgit Baltistan into a province. There are several drivers propelling Pakistan's thinking in this direction, most important being the growing discontent amongst the local people on continued political deprivation for decades. Since the China Pakistan Economic Corridor is going to be built through the region, there are rising concerns in large section of the locals whether they would get a share in the benefits accruing from the proposed network project worth billions. On several occasions in past, Gilgit Baltistan has been deprived of a rightful economic share citing lack of a definite constitutional status. In the wake of the CPEC, being hailed as a dream project that would transform the economic fortune of Pakistan, there is a growing sense of wariness amongst local population on the possibility whether lack of a political status would yet again deprive them of a share in the proceeds flowing from the mega project. The common opinion is somewhat divided on the provincial issue- there are widespread concerns whether incorporating Gilgit Baltistan as a full-fledged province of Pakistan would undermine their position on the broader Kashmir issue. Cognizant of such repercussions, a section is of the opinion that a provisional provincial status be given to the region instead of full integration of Gilgit Baltistan, as indicated in some of the reports included in the current issue.

The leader of Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM), Altaf Hussain, has stirred controversy in the so called 'AJK' by allegedly criticizing the Pakistan army. Severely censuring Hussain's statement, the 'AJK' legislative assembly adopted at least 9 resolutions demanding that he be prosecuted for high treason. Some members in the 'AJK' assembly also demanded that the MQM be banned or else its leaders abandon their ties with Altaf Hussain who is based in London in the United Kingdom.

"Road to recognition: Provisional constitutional status demanded for G-B"

The legal fraternity of Gilgit-Baltistan has called for a provisional constitutional status for the region. On August 29, G-B Bar Council Vice President, Shehbaz Khan, stated the conclusion has been reached after "hectic deliberations". "The ruling will allow representation from G-B in both the upper and lower houses of Pakistan," he stated. Shehbaz added the proposal was the outcome of a two-day moot arranged by the Lawyers Action Committee – a forum consisting legal practitioners from the Supreme Appellate Court bar and other local associations of lawyers. "This will not harm Pakistan's position on Kashmir and at the same time ensure the voice of G-B is heard," he stated. The bar council office-bearer further noted that another option is to grant G-B a status similar to that of Azad Kashmir.

Taqi Akhunzada, "The case of Chitral and GB"

Chitral and its neighbouring districts in KPK are experiencing the effects of the second most devastating floods, after the 2010 floods. Big to medium-sized boulders carried by the gushing river have caused huge damage. The newly installed government of Gilgit Baltistan (GB) is facing challenges in the shape of floods hardly a month after assuming power. GB Chief Minister Hafeezur Rehman in his recent visit to the affected areas stated that an estimated Rs700 million will be required to restore the infrastructure damaged by the floods, while it would take two month to evaluate the total loss caused by the disaster. GB usually gets two types of flood, one due to the massive flow of water in rivers, particularly River Indus, and two due to glacier lake outburst flood (GLOF) because of erosion, build-up of water pressure, an avalanche of rock or volcanic eruption. In the last five decades, the temperature around Karakorum and its adjacent areas has increased by 0.50 degree Celsius per decade. And that is why cold climate is not too severe in the area. So far, the floods have claimed 30 lives in GB and 2 in Chitral. Mostly fruits trees, standing crop and cultivated land have been damaged.

"Parting ways: MQM G-B leader resigns"

Muttahida Qaumi Movement Gilgit-Baltistan leader Sayid Abid Iqbal resigned from the party. Talking to the media at the press club on August 5, Iqbal stated he announced the resignation over party chief Altaf Hussain's recent speech. "His recent statements against the armed forces prove he is working for the enemies," he added. He urged all patriots within MQM to part ways with the party. A resident of Chilas town, Iqbal is stated to be the first MQM ticketholder from the region. He won the party its first seat from Shigar Valley of Baltistan during the 2009 Gilgit-Baltistan Legislative Assembly elections. He was serving as the Diamer zonal in-charge of the party. On July 29, an antiterrorism court in Gilgit issued non-bailable arrest warrants for Hussain for using derogatory language against Pakistan Army and the paramilitary forces. The decision was announced by judge Raja Shabab of ATC-I. The court became the first in the country to issue warrants for the MQM supremo.

Tariq Naqash, "Two AJK Shariat Court judges removed"

Two judges of the Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) Shariat Court stood removed on August 8 after a full bench of the AJK High Court set aside the piece of

law under which they were appointed in March 2015. Appointment of Sardar Mohammad Shehzad Khan and Mushtaq Ahmed Janjua as Shariat Court judges was challenged in the high court by advocates Sardar Javed Naz and Sardar Tahir Anwar Khan on April 27. The petitioners named the AJK government, its law department, Legislative Assembly and both appointees as respondents. The AJK Shariat Court is not a constitutional court but was established in 1993 through subordinate legislation under the AJK Shariat Court Act to hear appeals about matters pertaining to family disputes, murder cases and all other Islamic penal offences. Appointment of Shariat Court judges, whose perks and privileges are equivalent to those of high court judges, was sole prerogative of the AJK government, unlike judges of the high and supreme courts who are first required to be recommended by chief justices. However, in September 2014, the AJK Supreme Court declared a section of the Shariat Court Act, 1993, ultra vires of the AJK Constitution, and resultantly all appointments of judges in Shariat Court made under that law were declared void.

"Novel idea: G-B govt to buy back guns from locals"

In a bid to rid Gilgit-Baltistan of weapons, the government has decided to purchase all the guns from the people. G-B Chief Minister Hafeezur Rahman's novel idea will soon be implemented, stated a CM House spokesperson on August 23. Traders of illegal arms in the region have minted hefty sums amid the sectarian conflict that has escalated over the years. "The arms will be purchased from residents on reasonable rates to ensure they spend the money on other necessities," stated the spokesperson. "The move doesn't just stop at buying back guns. There will be scanners installed at exit and entry points of G-B to check vehicles for weapons in order to curtail smuggling. Around 150 CCTV cameras will also be installed at different places." A modern tracking system will be implemented to ensure illegal weapons do not enter the region again. In an attempt to get traders and local notables on board, the government has urged them to pitch in and help purchase weapons and equipment. "Traders have agreed to donate close to 100 cameras," the spokesperson added.

"The persecuted Chinese Muslims find home and identity in Pakistan"

Since 1949 thousands of Uighur Muslims left China and the thriving trading town of Kashgar to settle down in Gilgit. The Muslim community of Xinjiang province of China were forced to leave as they were the victims of cultural and religious oppression in the country, reported BBC. Insa Khan was only a few years old when she left Xinjiang with her family to travel to Pakistan. She is now 71 vears old and has spent most of her life living in Gilgit. As a Muslim, she has religious freedom. And due to strong ties between China and Pakistan, she can also visit relatives in the autonomous Chinese province of Xinjiang. China says its development projects have brought prosperity to Xinjiang's big cities. However, development in Xinjiang is under government control and ownership, and Uighur Muslims point to numerous restrictions that prevent them from celebrating their Muslim culture and rituals.

Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) Prime Minister Chaudhry Abdul Majeed on August 5 has demanded of the government to try Muttahida Quami Movement (MQM) Chief Altaf Hussain for treason. "Foreign powers are using MQM chief to fan violence in Karachi and defame Pakistan's Armed Forces which are struggling hard to purge the port city of terrorists and criminals," he stated. He stated that Pakistan was passing through difficult times as its enemies are conspiring to destabilise the country. "The enemies do not want Pakistan to become economically stable and want to sabotage mega projects like China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), Gwadar Port and Iran-Pakistan gas pipeline," he stated. An international conspiracy is being hatched to destabilise the country," he added. He demanded of Adviser to Prime Minister on foreign Affairs Sartaj Aziz to take up the Kashmir issue with Indian leadership boldly during his visit to New Delhi and should not budge an inch from its principled stance. "We will give every sacrifice for the solidarity and security of the country and will stand shoulder to shoulder with the All Parties Hurrivat Conference (APHC) leadership for the cause of Kashmir," he further stated. "Regional Elections in GB 77% transparent"

According to a poll conducted by Gilani Research Foundation; only 53% of the respondents had heard about the regional elections in Gilgit Baltistan, while 77% believed that these when conducted were transparent. "Legislators demand GB as a 'province of Pakistan"

Gilgit-Baltistan Legislative Assembly on August 11 adopted a unanimous resolution demanding of the federal government to declare GB as the constitutional province of Pakistan, according to local media sources. The resolution was tabled by Pakistan People's Party member Imran Nadeem Shigri, and Islami Tehreek-i-Pakistan's Captain (r) Mohammad Shafi. The resolution noted that the people of Gilgit-Baltistan won freedom from Dogora Raj and joined Pakistan without any condition in 1948. Since then GB has been deprived of basic rights, particularly constitutional rights, stated the resolution as reports noted. It demanded that GB be given representation in the National Assembly and Senate till solution of the Kashmir issue in light of the United Nations resolutions.

The region's jugular vein – the Karakoram Highway – has in the recent past witnessed a spate of organised terror attacks. With the challenges surfacing once again, those who frequent the road quite often have an issue to confront. In view of fresh threats and intelligence information, the

Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa government recently made it compulsory for transport companies to have private guards on board before setting foot on the highway. The road that connects China with the rest of the country through Gilgit-Baltistan, passes majorly through Kohistan district where terrorists clad in military outfits have attacked passenger buses in the past. "When the K-P police check buses for security arrangements at check posts in Kohistan, they allow them to go as they see uniformed men inside," stated a bus terminal official in Gilgit. Sources went on to say the bus owners even hire guns from dealers. "In reality these guns aren't worth tuppence. If trained terrorists cross the path of these buses, only divine help can save the defenceless passengers." One of the most gruesome attacks in the recent past was when militants dressed in army uniforms, dragged 16 men out of the buses in Kohistan and shot them dead. The outlawed militant group Jundallah had claimed responsibility for the brutality.

"This practice should be stopped immediately," Rahman stated during his visit to the under-construction Choongi-Public Chowk Road on August 18. "Only material produced by Attock Refinery Limited should be used." The CM also directed works department officials to ensure their presence and constant supervision of the repair work. "We aren't going to compromise on these things," Rahman stated. "This is the only reason why the people voted us into power."

"Govt issues notification for special economic zones in GB"

Given the concerns by various quarters, the federal government has at last issued a notification to set up special economic zones in Gilgit-Baltistan under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) project to improve socio-economic conditions of the people living in this strategically important region. The notification issued by the Ministry of Planning and Development directed the Minerals and Industries Department of Gilgit-Baltistan to identify potential sites for establishment of special economic zones. Sources noted that the Minerals and Industries Department of GB has immediately directed the concerned officials to launch an immediate survey and identify sites where work on establishment of special economic zones can be initiated in coordination with the federal government. It is pertinent to mention that the Gilgit-Baltistan Legislative Assembly unanimously passed a resolution on 12th of August to urge the federal government to set up two economic zones in the region. The sources stated the Chinese officials have asked the Pakistani counterparts to select those sites for special economic zones where provision of steel, light industries, garments and others are available sufficiently in order to meet requirements of mass scale industrialisation.

Mushtaq Paracha, "CM asks federal govt to start work on Diamer-Bhasha dam"

Chief Minister of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Pervez Khattak on August 7 urged the federal government to launch construction work on Diamer-Bhasha and other small dams to protect the province from floods in the future. Speaking at a public meeting in Bara Banda Union Council, he stated the construction of the dams would help reduce risk of floods in the changing climate and help overcome energy crisis. Provincial Minister for Excise and Taxation Mian Jamshiduddin Kakakhel and other local party leaders and office-bearers were present on the occasion. About 39 councillors-elect announced joining the Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf (PTI). The chief minister urged the federal government to give the province its share in the Chinese investment in the country and launch mega uplift projects in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. He stated the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf-led provincial government had allocated Rs10 billion in the budget for the fiscal 2015-16 to build the embankments along the Kabul and other rivers to protect the affected areas from floods. The chief minister stated that building embankments along the rivers had been started. "The work will be completed in two years," he added.Pervez Khattak stated that his government would construct of small dams to help prevent floods. He stated the provincial government had launched a tree plantation campaign across the province to prevent land erosion and tackle the threat of floods.

"Humayun Iqbal, The Kalabagh lobby"

This refers to the letter, 'The Kalabagh mantra' (August 7) by Imtiaz Ali Qazilbash. The letter is full of contradictions. At one place the writer says that the country's hydro potential of 100,000MW should be tapped while at the same time he opposes the construction of a reservoir of 4,000MG at a place that is the only feasible site available for constructing a dam. The writer has advocated the Diamer-Bhasha and Munda dams but failed to tell us why the Diamer-Bhasha Dam has not been built since its inauguration in 2006. The reason is that not a single donor is ready to fund the project due to several reasons including seismological issues. Work on the Munda Dam was started in the Musharraf era by an American firm which later ran away because the area was prone to flash floods. Cheap electricity can be generated due to the best flow of water available at Kalabagh. The dam can be built at one-third the cost of the Diamer-Bhasha Dam. In addition, it can save Sindh and southern Punjab from flooding every year. People should now realise the importance of the Kalabagh Dam.

Fawad Yousafzai, "PC opposes Bhasha Dam's 2nd feasibility sans funds pledge"

The Planning Commission has opposed the idea of conducting second feasibility of the Bhasha Dam, without the prior commitment of funding for the project from the lenders, saying it is waste of time and will further increase the estimated cost of the project. "Yes the government has consulted the Planning Commission regarding the second feasibility of the Bhasha Hydropower project, by the USTATED, and the commission has stated no to the idea," an official source noted. If the USTATED or any other lender can make a commitment for funding of the project, it is well and good, otherwise doing feasibility is nothing but just a futile exercise which will cause delay in the implementation of the project for another couple of years and will escalate its total cost, the source informed. Earlier the Asian Development Bank (ADB) had made a commitment and then backtracked from it but this time the commitment should not be verbal, the official added. If they want they can review the already completed feasibility study and can make the desired changes to it, as it can be done in three to four months' time, while the new feasibility needs at least 24 to 36 months' time, the source further added. The official stated the pre-feasibility study of the project had been completed few years back by a well reputed international firm but the US wanted the feasibility study of international standards and parameters.

"Chinese company offered eight projects"

Pakistan has initially offered around 8 hydel power projects on upper Indus to the Chinese firm Three Gorges Corporation which established the world's largest dam in China. These projects were identified in preliminary talks held with a delegation of

Chinese energy Company, Three Gorges Corporation (TGC), led by Qin guo Bin, Chief Executive, which called on Minister for Water and Power Khawaja Asif on August 25. CTG owns and operates the Three Gorges Dam, the world's largest hydroelectric power plant with a capacity of 22,500 megawatts. During the meeting, projects like Diamer-Bhasha, Bunji, Thakot, Muda and other hydropower projects were identified with the combined capacity of 35,000MW hydel generation. Official familiar with the development stated that senior officials of Ministry of Water and Power were on a visit to China to hold energy talks and a detailed meeting would be held on August 28. The Chinese government-owned CTG expressed an interest in financing projects in Pakistan in conjunction with the International Finance Corporation, a World Bank subsidiary. The offer is in addition to the \$46 billion financing for power and transportation infrastructure being provided by the Chinese government and Chinese banks to Pakistan for the construction of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). According to studies conducted by the Water and Power Development Authority, Pakistan has an identified potential of producing up to 60,000 MW of hydroelectric power, of which 40,000 MW is located in a region called the Indus Cascade, which begins in Skardu in Gilgit-Baltistan and runs through to Tarbela, the site of Pakistan's biggest dam, in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa. Of this, only 6919 MW has been tapped so far.

"Rs 47 billion allocated for AJK, GB under PSDP"

A meeting of the Senate Standing Committee on Kashmir Affairs and Gilgit-Baltistan was held under the chairmanship of Senator Sajid Mir at Parliament House in Islamabad. Minister for Kashmir Affairs Barjees Tahir informed the Committee that 47 billion rupees have been allocated for Azad Jammu and Kashmir and GilgitBaltistan under Public Sector Development Programme. He stated that PC-1 is ready for Rawalpindi to Muzaffarabad motorway and a railway line and Kail to Giligt- Baltistan roads. Replying to a question about Azad Kashmir Projects, he stated Prime Minister has allocated five hundred million rupees for Azad Kashmir development projects and one hundred and fifty million rupees for Gilgit Baltistan flood hit areas.

"Dialogue only way to resolve Kashmir issue, says Dr Fai"

World Kashmir Awareness Secretary General Dr Ghulam Nabi Fai has stated that the Kashmiris firmly believe that the only way to achieve a peaceful and lasting solution to the Jammu Kashmir. Addressing a gathering here, he stated that there could be no solution to the Kashmir issue without the participation of the Kashmiri leadership in any process to settle it. He reiterated that it was a fact that Jammu Kashmir was not the integral part of any member state of the United Nations. "In this regard, we appreciate the statement of Peter R Lavoy, special assistant to US President Barack Obama on South Asian Affairs (Pakistan and India) to address these issues together. I expect that they probably will," Dr Fai quoted the aide statement. Dr Fai emphasised that the time has come for the world powers especially the United States to recognise the people of Jammu Kashmir as the central party to the issue. During the function, a 'million march' was also announced. The march will take place on October 25, 2015 in front of the United Nations in New York. The 'million march' will help the efforts of the Kashmiri expatriates to educate policymakers regarding the current situation in the disputed state and to focus attention on efforts to bring Pakistan, India and Kashmiri leadership to the negotiating table to explore all possible options to settle the issue once and for all.

"Intra-Kashmir journalists workshop concludes"

After the conclusion of a two-day intra-Kashmir journalists workshop at Islamabad Club in which a group of 29 journalists from Kashmir valley and Azad Jammu Kashmir (AJK) participated, several recommendations were agreed upon by consensus over issues relating to them on the two sides of the Line of Control (LoC) and finding ways and means for removing the existing barriers between them. The journalists also formed a joint four-member group which would be responsible for content sharing among different media organisations and also a joint working group of the journalists from the two sides. The workshop, a first of its kind, jointly organised by Kashmir Institute of International Relations (KIIR) and Centre for Peace Development and Reforms (CPDR), recommended a 12-point agenda.
