Satellite photos show China's new nuclear test site in Xinjiang

China is expanding its nuclear test facilities in the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region, an analysis of satellite photographs obtained by Nikkei suggests. Beijing halted explosive tests in the area a quarter of a century ago. Nikkei has viewed satellite photographs with a number of experts that appear to confirm China is strengthening its nuclear testing capability. Extensive coverings have been erected on a mountainside in this arid region, and broken rocks piled up nearby are believed to be evidence of excavation of a new "sixth tunnel" for testing hidden beneath. Power transmission cables and a facility that could be used for storing high-explosives have recently been installed, while unpaved white roads lead from a command post in various directions.

China plans to view the universe's dark past using a fleet of telescopes orbiting the moon

A team of Chinese scientists have proposed sending a fleet of telescopes to orbit the moon and peek into the most mysterious era of the universe's past. The Discovering the Sky at the Longest Wavelength (DSL) mission, if officially approved in the coming weeks, would shed light on the so-called cosmic dark ages, a time when the infant universe was nothing but a sea of darkness. Astronomers believe the first stars appeared when the universe was about 200 million years old. Before that, the world was a rather obscure and empty place: no suns, no planets – only the hydrogen atoms forged from the Big Bang.

PLA drills involving missiles, J-20 stealth fighters surround Taiwan as Pelosi lands on island

Immediately after Pelosi's plane landed in Taipei, the PLA Eastern Theater Command announced it will start a series of joint military operations around the island of Taiwan.

Countries with largest nuclear arsenals should reduce warheads first: Chinese official

The countries with the largest nuclear arsenals should further conduct a significant and substantive reduction in their nuclear arsenals in a verifiable, irreversible and legally binding manner, said a Chinese disarmament official. The principles of "maintaining global strategic stability" and "undiminished security for all" should be followed in the practices of nuclear disarmament, Fu Cong told the 10th Review Conference of the Parties to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons. The countries with the largest nuclear arsenals taking the lead in reduction will create conditions for other nuclear-weapon states to join the nuclear disarmament process, he said.

PLA aircraft carrier group with nuclear-powered submarine joins drills around Taiwan: expert

The Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) has sent an aircraft carrier group featuring at least one nuclear-powered submarine to the ongoing drills around the island of Taiwan for its first carrier deterrence exercise, said an expert affiliated with the PLA. Zhang Junshe, a senior research fellow at the Naval Research Academy of the PLA, told the Global Times on that the PLA's drills from Thursday to Sunday around the island of Taiwan will feature the PLA's first aircraft carrier group deterrence exercise, which will establish a maritime multidimensional combat system. "Normally, a nuclear-powered submarine will accompany an aircraft carrier group in its mission," Zhang said. The expert confirmed with the Global Times that at least one nuclear-powered submarine has been deployed. While the drills are organized by the PLA Eastern Theater Command, forces from other theater commands also participated in the drills, Zhang said. "This reflects the high interoperability between PLA's various theater commands," he said.

Chinese space station's new robotic arm flexes muscles during in-orbit tests

A seven-jointed robotic arm on China's Tiangong space station has completed in-orbit tests, allowing for more agility and precision in tasks such as moving supplies and repairing equipment. The arm, which is 5 metres (16.4 feet) long and mounted on the recently launched Wentian lab module, performed a series of actions including disengaging from its base and crawling on the surface of the space station, according to a video released by the China Manned Space Agency. While crawling, it docked with and undocked from four adaptors on the space station's surface to make sure they were working. The arm also checked the space station's solar arrays and external mounting points, the agency said.

PLA's 'Taiwan lockdown' drills stun secessionists, external forces as precision strike, area denial capabilities proved

Pelosi says U.S. will not let China isolate Taiwan

The U.S. will not allow China to isolate Taiwan, U.S. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi said in Tokyo, capping a weeklong trip that saw her visit Hawaii, Singapore, Malaysia, Taiwan, South Korea and Japan. Speaking at a news conference at the U.S. Embassy, the speaker said, "The Chinese have tried to isolate Taiwan, keeping them most recently from the World Health Organization," pointing to the pressure Beijing applied to block Taiwan from attending the WHO's annual assembly in May. "They may try to keep Taiwan from visiting or participating in other places, but they will not isolate Taiwan by preventing us to travel there,"

she said. Responding to a question asking if the visit was more about burnishing her credentials than benefiting Taiwan, Pelosi called the suggestion "ridiculous."

The drills are a "serious problem that impacts our national security and the safety of our citizens", Kishida told reporters.

China launches reusable spacecraft, new step to support peaceful use of space

Reusable spacecraft represent a trend in the industry, so it is necessary for China to carry out research and development (R&D) of such spacecraft, Song Zhongping, an expert and TV commentator on military and aerospace issues, told the Global Times.

China's second lab module Mengtian for space station moved to launch site

China's Mengtian lab module, one of the two such modules destined for the China Space Station, has recently been moved to Wenchang Spacecraft Launch Site in south China's Hainan Province, China Manned Space Agency revealed. Assembly and relevant testing will follow as planned, the agency said, without disclosing a timeline. All equipment at the launch site are standing by and all systems for testing are being prepared. The Mengtian lab module, the final component of the space station, is slated to be launched in October. By that time, China's space station will be expanded from the basic foundational core module into a T-shaped three-module structure, with the core module Tianhe in the center and the two lab modules, Wentian and Mengtian, on either side. A maximum of six people can stay in the station.

Chinese space telescope team hopes to join race to find Earth-like planets – and maybe signs of life

Researchers in China have completed the concept study for a 6-metre (20-foot) space telescope to examine the atmosphere of nearby Earth-like planets and search for signs of life with unprecedented precision. If selected to enter the design phase, the HABItable Terrestrial planetary ATmospheric Surveyor – or Habitats – will join the global race to find a twin of planet Earth. With a potential price tag of over 10 billion yuan (US\$1.48 billion), it will also be the most ambitious and expensive space science project China has ever funded. Thanks to telescopes such as Kepler and TESS surveying the sky for planets outside the solar system, humanity has discovered more than 5,000 exoplanets and edged ever closer to answering the question "are we alone in the universe?"

China upgrades nuke test site with an eye on Taiwan

Satellite photos obtained by Nikkei last week show that China is rapidly expanding its nuclear test facilities in western Xinjiang, sparking fears of a renewed nuclear arms race with the US as tensions boil over

Taiwan. The Nikkei report states that a satellite hovering at 450 kilometers detected extensive construction at the Lop Nur test site, a dried salt lakebed in the arid and restive Xinjiang region that borders Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Afghanistan, and Pakistan. The report said that China may be building a sixth tunnel for underground testing, evidenced by broken rocks piled nearby and extensive coverings erected on a nearby mountainside. The satellite photos also show power cables, possible storage facilities for high explosives and unpaved roads from command centers.

China wary of South Korea's US-centered policy

"While the two countries head toward the 30th anniversary of the establishment of South Korea-China diplomatic ties, both sides should maintain independence without being affected by the outside," Wang said, adding that the two countries should consider each other's interests. "We have to adhere to a win-win to ensure a stable and smooth supply chain," he added.

Top Chinese, South Korean diplomats pledge closer ties

The top South Korean and Chinese diplomats pledged Tuesday to develop closer relations and maintain stable industrial supply chains at a time of deepening rivalry between Beijing and Washington. South Korea, a longtime U.S. ally, is struggling to strike a balance between Washington and the increasingly assertive foreign policy of Chinese President Xi Jinping's government. U.S.-Chinese conflict over Taiwan has added to complications for governments that want amicable ties with both sides. Yoon, who took office in May, wants to strengthen security cooperation with Washington and Japan in response to North Korean nuclear threats. China, North Korea's main ally, sees Japan as a strategic rival but also is South Korea's biggest export market. South Korea's pursuit of closer ties with Washington could possibly complicate relations with China. South Korea is weighing whether to participate in a U.S.-led semiconductor alliance involving Taiwan and Japan, which China sees as an economic threat.

'Potentially catastrophic' China sparks Taiwan panic over fears Xi will 'use nuclear card'

Beijing has put the world on red alert after conducting a series of military drills surrounding the east Asian island it claims sovereignty over. While it now claims it has completed the drills, in which it "effectively tested the integrated joint combat capabilities of the troops", US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's visit sparked fears that this was China's preparation for an invasion. In an interview with Jacobin magazine, Lyle J. Goldstein, an associate professor at the Strategic Research Department at the US Naval War College (NWC), said: "If I were to blame Pelosi for anything, it's that, in the nuclear age, this kind of posturing is ridiculous and should be condemned widely." He added that "in the field of US-China military studies, we don't talk a lot about tactical nuclear weapons, but Chinese strategists talk about this a lot these days, especially because they were a feature of the US-Soviet rivalry".

China has world's second largest number of nuclear power units: official

China has the second largest number of nuclear power units in operation or under construction in the world, Tang Bo, an official with the National Nuclear Safety Administration, said. Speaking at the opening ceremony of the 29th International Conference on Nuclear Engineering (ICONE), Tang said that, as of June this year, China had 54 nuclear power units in operation, and 23 were under construction. The development of nuclear power has helped China ensure an adequate energy supply, improve the environment and move closer to its goal of carbon peaking and carbon neutrality, Tang said. Wang Shoujun, head of the Chinese Nuclear Society, said that the total operational installed capacity of the country's nuclear power is expected to reach roughly 70 million kilowatts by 2025.
