In recent years, to safeguard its global hegemony, the United States has continuously generalized the concept of national security, abused export control measures, and even sacrificed the interests of its allies, coerced and wooed other countries to suppress and contain China's semiconductors, and artificially promoted industrial decoupling and chain breaking, said the spokesperson.

Russia buying civilian drones from China for war effort

Russia has for months been importing drones from Chinese companies explicitly for use in its invasion of Ukraine, despite denials from Beijing that such equipment is being deployed in the war, a Nikkei Asia investigation has found. Since the beginning of the invasion 16 months ago, Beijing has repeatedly denied providing weapons to Moscow for use in the invasion. And while previous reporting has shown that Russia stepped up its imports of Chinese drones after the war began, Beijing has denied that China is exporting drones to the battlefields of Ukraine.

The People's Republic of China is currently in the process of radically expanding its arsenal of conventional and nuclear land-based missile launchers. Over the past decade China has doubled the number of combat missile brigades in the People's Liberation Army Rocket Force (PLARF), and has unveiled a myriad of new capabilities, including missiles capable of firing both conventional and nuclear warheads, and missiles equipped with hypersonic glide vehicles designed to evade missile defences.

Hypersonic War: Chinese YJ-21 vs. US HALO - Both China & US fast-track Air-Launched hypersonics

While this weapon has been fired from PLA-Navy ships in tests in recent years, it has not previously been cited as existing in an air-launched variant.

Tan Kefei responded that "the U.S. ignores China's core concerns, crudely interferes in China's internal affairs, and deliberately escalates tensions across the Taiwan Strait."

Buoys over troubled water: Chinese tech helps researchers monitor 'pulse of Pacific Ocean'

The US is a leader in ocean monitoring, but China has been catching up. In recent years, Chinese researchers have deployed a growing number of high quality monitoring devices, particularly in marine areas where the strategic interests of the two nations overlap. "By 2022 the CKEO buoys had been conducting continuous observations in situ for more than three years. An enormous amount of data has been collected," said the Chinese research team led by professor Chen Zhaohui, from the Ocean University of China in Qingdao, Shandong in the paper.

Around two-thirds of the world's lithium and cobalt—essential for electric cars—is processed in China. The country is the source of nearly 60% of aluminium, also used in EV batteries, and 80% of polysilicon, an ingredient in solar panels. It has an even tighter grip on rare-earth minerals that go into crucial technologies, like making smartphone touch screens and missile-defence systems, accounting for 90% of their refining, according to the International Energy Agency.

Sharing Rockets: China opens first auction for Long March 'carpooling'

China will open access to its Long March rocket to Chinese commercial satellites for the first time via an open auction system on July 13, in a move experts believe will reduce the cost of commercial access to space and boost high demand for space applications. The bidding will start at 80,000 yuan (around \$11,078) per kilogram, and the China Aerospace Science and Technology Corporation (CASC) will handle the information and transactions related to the auctioned rocket launch service.
