The Chinese 'spy balloon' shot down by US missile wasn't one of ours, says country's biggest weather balloon maker

China's largest balloon manufacturer has denied any involvement in the "spy balloon" incident in the United States this month. A Chinese balloon that drifted across American airspace and was shot down by the US Air Force on live television has sparked conjecture about Chinese espionage and prompted Secretary of State Antony Blinken to cancel a trip to China on February 5-6. The US is confident the manufacturer of the balloon "has a direct relationship with China's military and is an approved vendor of the [People's Liberation Army], according to information published in an official procurement portal for the PLA," said a senior US State Department official quoted by NBC.

The Philippines has accused China of targeting one of its coast guard vessels with a military-grade laser in the South China Sea, as Beijing's almost-constant presence in the contested waters raises regional tensions. The Chinese coast guard ship directed the laser at the BRP Malapascua twice on February 6, "causing temporary blindness to [the] crew at the bridge", the Philippine Coast Guard said on Monday. The incident happened in Ayungin Shoal, a Philippine-controlled land feature also known as Second Thomas Shoal, it added.

The Philippine coast guard (PCG) said its vessel was assisting a navy mission to deliver food and supplies to troops stationed on an atoll in the disputed waterway on Feb. 6 when a Chinese coast guard ship directed a "military-grade laser" at the ship temporarily blinding its crew at the bridge." I think it's time for the Chinese government to restrain its forces so that it does not commit any provocative act that will endanger the lives of people," military spokesperson Medel Aguilar told reporters.

China accuses US of 10 balloon incursions in its airspace

China has accused the US of repeatedly flying surveillance balloons into its airspace, allegations Washington immediately denied, as tensions between the two nations reached a new high. Beijing's accusations came after the US shot down what it said was a Chinese spy balloon off the coast of South Carolina this month and subsequently downed three other objects, most recently at the weekend. "It's very common that the US intrudes [into] others' airspace," Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin said on Monday. "Just last year, more than 10 American high-altitude balloons illegally flew through Chinese airspace without permission from the relevant Chinese authorities."

Beijing to support leading AI enterprises to build models similar to ChatGPT

Beijing announced that it will support leading artificial intelligence (AI) enterprises to build large models similar to ChatGPT, the AI-enabled chatbot developed by Silicon Valley-based OpenAI, and it will strengthen the layout of AI computing infrastructure and the supply of AI data. The Beijing White Paper on the development of the AI Industry in 2022 was released, outlining the city's achievements and expectations in the field of AI. The paper emphasized that Beijing had 1,048 leading AI enterprises by October 2022, accounting for 29 percent of the total AI enterprises in China, ranking first in the country. Additionally, the city has a strong industrial agglomeration capacity and a well-developed full-stack artificial intelligence industrial chain.

The second phase of a high-definition deep-space active observation facility, China Fuyan, which is dubbed as the world's most far-reaching radar system, kicked off in Southwest China's Chongqing Municipality, the Global Times learned from the project lead Beijing Institute of Technology (BIT). The second phase of the project, codenamed China Fuyan [faceted eye], will involve building 25 radars with a 30-meter aperture, so as to realize the detection and imaging of asteroids over 10 million kilometers away, which will provide strong support for China's near-Earth asteroid impact defense and planetary science research.

The US military has recovered important electronic components from the suspected Chinese spy balloon that was shot down this month off the coast of South Carolina, Northern Command said. The US military command said crews had retrieved significant debris, including all the "priority sensor and electronics pieces" as well as large sections of the structure. Retrieval of the sensors and other electronic components is critical to US efforts to demonstrate that the balloon was a surveillance craft and not a civilian airship conducting meteorological research as China has claimed.

China to launch 2 crewed missions each year: China Manned Space Agency

China will send two manned spacecraft and one or two cargo spacecraft every year to its space station, which has entered a new phase of application and development following its completion last year, said China Manned Space Agency (CMSA). The CMSA introduced the country's 2023 space mission plan in the newly initiated solicitation announcement for the mission logos. China will send the Tianzhou-6 cargo ship in May to dock with the aft port of the core module, forming a configuration of three modules and two ships. It will take supplies for the in-orbit taikonauts, maintenance spare parts, propellants and samples of applied mission payloads. In-orbit wastes will be brought back by the cargo ship.
